

Friends, join us for weekly worship and the many youth and adult activities starting up this month.



September 1st - Ecclesiastical New Year

September 1st is the first day of the Orthodox Ecclesiastical Year. It is called the beginning of the "indinction". The word "indinction" is a Latin word meaning "impose", to make somebody do something. It was first applied in imposing taxes in Egypt. The Roman Emperor Diocletian extended the system of taxing conquered people to the whole Roman Empire. The first official worldwide indinction originated with Emperor Constantine in 312AD when he saw a miraculous vision of the "sign of the cross" on the skies. The Church picked this day to begin its calendar year for various reasons:

Before the Julian calendar, the Romans began their year on September 1st. According to Holy Tradition, it was on September 1st that our Blessed Lord first entered the Jewish Synagogue (Luke 4) to preach His mission to men. Jesus, quoted from the 61st chapter of the book of Isaiah: "The spirit of the Lord is upon me, because the Lord had anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek, he has sent me to bind up the openings of the prison to them that are bound. To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all that mourn."

Tradition also tells us that it was during the month of September that the Hebrews finally entered the Promised Land.

It has always been accepted within the church community that the month of September was the time to gather all the fruits of the summer months and prepare for the beginning of the winter months ahead. At the start of the new year, hymnographers also prepared beautiful hums to be chanted during church services. The hymns were offered to Almighty God so that we might receive His divine blessings throughout the coming year.

ECCLESIASTICAL NEW YEAR

The First Ecumenical Council decreed that the Church's year should begin on September 1st. The month of September was, for the Jews, the beginning of the civil year (see Exodus 12:2), the month of the gathering of fruits and the bringing to God of sacrifices of thanksgiving. It was at the time of this feast that the Lord Jesus went into the synagogue in Nazareth, opened the Book of the Prophet Isaiah and read the words: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me; because He hath anointed Me to preach good tidings unto the meek; He hath sent Me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to them that are bound; to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance' (Is. 61: 1-2; cf. Luke 4: 16-21). This month of September is also noted in the history of Christianity because it was during September that Constantine the Great was victorious over Maxentius, the enemy of the Christian faith, a victory followed by the granting of freedom of confession of the Christian faith throughout the whole Roman Empire. For a long time, the civil year in the Christian world was reckoned in the same way as the Church's year, from September 1st, but it was later changed to January 1st, first in western Europe and then also in Russia in the time of Peter the Great.

September 8st - Nativity of the Theotokos

The establishment of four major feast days to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary took place in the days of the apostolic era and has significance in the Greek Orthodox Church which has remained unaltered through twenty centuries of Christianity. The mother of the Son of God is honored on March 25th, the day of Annunciation when the Archangel Gabriel told Mary she was to become the mother of Jesus Christ; the Repose of the blessed Virgin Mary on August 15th; on November 21st, the Entrance of the Blessed Theotokos to the Temple; and on February 2nd when the Mother of God brought the infant Jesus to the temple for presentation forty days after His birth.

A fifth day of commemoration is celebrated on September 8th, honoring the Virgin Mary on the day of her birth. This day was set aside by the Orthodox Church in the early first century, but not observed until the eighth century when Pope Sergios saw fit to join with the Orthodox during his reign which extended from AD 687 to 701. All of Christendom agreed on the date that the Virgin Mary was born, but for some reason the date was not an official feast day in the Roman sector for more than a third of the length of existence of the Christian Church. The lack of communication between east and West ended in the Schism of 1054, a break which now appears to be an ever-narrowing gap, hopefully to be closed in a reunion upon which the Mother of God is sure to smile.

The familiar story of Mary's birth has had variations in splinter groups of Christianity, but there is no doubt that her birth came about as an act of God. Her parents, Joachim and Anna, were childless and were fast approaching the years which would place Anna beyond the age of childbearing. Perhaps it was because of the intensity of their prayers that a child be born to them that their prayers were not only answered, but their child would, in turn, bear a child ordained by God as His Son.

Although Mary is known as the mother of God, she has been accorded numerous titles in the Orthodox Church. They include, in addition to *Mary, Mother of God: The Repose (Koimisis) of the Blessed Virgin, Mary Pantanissa, Mary of Tenos, Mary of Malcheon and Mary of Vlacherne* just to mention a few of the many honors applied to her name, dozens more were listed in last month's bulletin). Considered the Mother of Mothers and the Mother of all Mankind, she is venerated in a manner which helps to sanctify the role of motherhood and the preservation of the family as the only hope for civilization.

It is regrettable that the immaculate conception not to be confused with the virginal birth of the Savior, is a concept of the Mother of God which the Roman Church has assumed in 1854 and with which the Orthodox Church is in disagreement. This concept holds that Mary was born without the stain of original sin brought upon all mankind by Adam and Eve. But the Orthodox position holds that since Jesus Christ is God, He is, therefore, the only one who is without the original stain. The point could be argued endlessly; but in spite of dogmatic differences, there is no lessening in the adoration of Mary as the Mother of God. There can be no doubt that she was made pure on the day of the Annunciation when told by Gabriel she was going to be the Virgin Mother of the Messiah. The Orthodox position stems from the concept that if the immaculate conception is taken literally, then Mary would assume the stature of goddess alongside God.






